Hanover County is offering two specialized recycling events in April. Both are open to Hanover residents only (ID required) and will take place at: Mechanicsville Convenience Center, 7427 Verdi Lane.

Household hazardous waste recycling, paper shredding

Residents can bring household hazardous waste for recycling and personal information or documents for shredding.

No fee will be charged for liquids, aerosols and solids. There's a limit of five gallons total, which is based on container size.

Materials accepted include:

Oil-based paints Household cleaners Flammables Pesticides and herbicides Corrosive liquids Solids, including pool/spa chemicals Acids Drain cleaner Up to four boxes (10"x12"x18"), paper bags or an equal number of documents will be accepted for shredding.

Electronics recycling

Hanover County residents can drop off electronics, including TVs and tablets, which will be removed from vehicles & recycled for FREE

Items accepted include:

Flat-screen monitors and televisions CRT (old convex style) monitors and CRT televisions Computers, tablets and cell phones (hard drive only for computers) Cell phones and tablets with internal batteries Printers and battery backups Rechargeable batteries, which can pose a fire hazard and should not be placed in household trash or recycling All small electrical items with a plug, including microwaves

The following will NOT be accepted: Alkaline batteries, smoke detectors and appliances containing Freon.
