Dover churches may send voting messengers to this meeting. In addition to voting messengers, the Association invites any Dover Baptist and their guests to share in this inspiring meeting and ministry event. Article 4 of Dover's Constitution states: "Each member church shall be entitled to send two messengers to Annual, Semiannual and special Called Association Meetings. A church that contributes at least \$400 to the General Fund during the Association's previous fiscal year shall be entitled to have three (3) messengers. An additional messenger is added for each additional \$400 contribution to the General Fund up to a maximum of seven (7) messengers for any church."

"Then the righteous will answer Him, saving, 'Lord, when did we see You hungry and feed You, or thirsty and give You drink? When did we see You a stranger and take You in, or naked and clothe You? Or when did we see You sick, or in prison, and come to You?' And the King will answer and say to them, 'Assuredly, I say to you, inasmuch as you did it to one of the least of these My brethren, you did it to Me. " - Matthew 25:37-40 (NKJV)

It was certainly a beautiful day for a walk and perfect weather to just sit on the front porch. Our guest did both. He began by strolling around our Dover Baptist Association building, and then casually plopped down on the wooden bench on our front entrance porch. Anticipating our doorbell to ring, I waited, and waited, but our guest didn't move, seemingly content to enjoy the Day our Lord hath made. I finally stepped outside, introduced myself and exchanged pleasantries with "Mr. F." Mr. F said he had hitchhiked down from New York to escape the

cold, and "God has blessed me [with a beautiful day]." He had spent the night here in the office park (perhaps on our bench, but I didn't ask). When I asked, he said he was hungry and thirsty. He politely passed on my offer to share my peanut butter and jelly sandwich, but promptly ate every remaining snack in our office and downed two bottles of Gatorade, and a few more bottles of water.

I asked Mr. F if he had a place to stay. He did not, so I began making calls to our Dover ministry partners. The good folks from Moments of Hope were the first to respond. I put Maureen from MoHope on speaker, and she began the intake process, but ran into a glitch when Mr. F let us know he neither had a cell phone nor any form of identification. She continued, and based on Mr. F's interview, he was fifty-nine, from Texas and had briefly attended Prairie View University, an HBCU in the state. Mr. F was pleasant and articulate, but as the intake interview continued, I (continued on next page)

excused myself to speak to Maureen privately. Mr. F also stated that he was currently in the military on active duty and a graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis. This was enough information to shift gears, and to not only find housing, but also mental health support. We hung up so Maureen could make a few calls. She got back to me and asked if there was any way I could get Mr. F to one of Richmond's homeless shelters that also offered mental health evaluations. "I have a truck and an Uber App," I chuckled. A couple of clicks on my iPhone, and soon thereafter, Farid, the Uber driver, pulled up in his pristine Toyota Corolla. "No bags?" Farid asked. "Nope," I responded. I confirmed the address and soon Mr. F was being driven to the shelter in style.

I had just spent much of the day with a homeless man, who was obviously carrying more baggage than the well-worn backpack that I surmise held his life's possessions. I had done what I felt was the right thing, but I felt conflicted. I thought what a privilege it is to serve and support our Dover churches-churches who actively answer the call of Christ to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked and visit the infirmed and imprisoned. I also pondered, "Am I part of the solution or system?" As a Baptist denomination, we adhere to a system of policies and procedures to be efficient stewards of our resources, and to defend our doctrinal beliefs, yet, more importantly, God often opens the door to allow us to be part of the solution, to live our faith, and to share the love of Jesus in word and deed.

On Saturday morning, April 27, pending an approval at our April 9th Executive Committee Meeting, we will have the unique opportunity to play a significant role in both the system and solution Semi-Annual Meeting. Encouraging reports highlighting our scholarships, ordinations, new pastors, ministry partners, budget & finance, and more will be presented. Prior to our business meeting, we will also be given the opportunity to observe and serve with our host-Biltmore Baptist Church-and a few of our ministry partners, in a hands-on Mission Immersion event, serving those Jesus called, the least of these. My prayer and hope are that you will join us, learn about the great things going on in your Dover Baptist Association, and be the hands, heart, feet, and voice of Jesus. God bless.
