or over four decades, I have closed the old year and began the new with the same two rituals. First, like thousands of others, I have made New Year's resolutions. I'm sure, similarly to many Christians, I have resolved to recommit to disciplines regarding my faith, fitness, and food. I have resolved to spend more time in God's Word, lead more like Jesus, spend regular time in prayer and fasting, exercise regularly, and cut down on toxic, processed and sugary foods.

The second ritual is one I've yet to find a single individual to share my obsession with. At various times, during every Advent and Christmas season, I have watched, read, and/or listened to at least one version of *A Christmas Carol*, the classic novella by Charles Dickens. This year I had the privilege to sit with hundreds of other folks as one of our Dover Baptist Association churches morphed this classic Dickens's tale into a beautiful (380-mile) Off-Broadway musical production. After that final scene in which Tiny Tim utters that classic supplication, "God bless us every one!" the audience was invited to stand and join the *A Christmas Carol* cast in singing Christmas carols. I left the church, as they say, "in the Christmas spirit," which often happens each year, and thus the reason it has become a ritual.

You are probably familiar with the Dickensian tale, and as a Christian, have caught the fact that this story of a sinner's redemption and forgiveness of those he trespassed against, is chock full of both direct and indirect allusions to the Christian faith. I think the most obvious is when Bob Cratchit recounts the words of his son, Tiny Tim. As the two emerge from their Christmas Eve worship service, as Cratchit later reflects, "He told me coming home, that he hoped the people saw him in the church, because he was a cripple, and it might be pleasant to them to remember upon Christmas Day who made lame beggars walk, and blind men see."

For the first time in over four decades and dozens of doses of Dickens, I am wondering if I've stumbled into another allusion to Jesus Christ, previously unthought of. In the story, the Ghost of Christmas Present entreats Scrooge to, "Come in! and know me better, man!" Did Dickens mean for the beseeching from this spirit to be an allegorical invitation to the heart of my Savior? Was the author feeling the need to remind his readers that Jesus stands at the door and knocks (Revelation 3:20)? Was this spirit who enters the scene crowned with a wreath of Holly an allusion to the One who exited a sinless life wearing a crown of thorns?

I don't know, but it reminds me that the Christmas spirit I'm feeling - and need to act upon - is the Holy Spirit indwelling in me, revealing Himself, once again, that I need to know Him

better. My prayer is that this newfound "Aha!" from classic literature, combined with Christian discipleship, will make my other ritual of New Year's resolutions, more attainable.
