As I write this blog, I find myself seated somewhere different than the familiar comfort of my desk or seat on my deck. I'm not listening to the birds chirping outside my home. The caring hospice workers who have left for the evening, tell me that my mother is "transitioning" from life to death, and it shouldn't be much longer. I gently correct them, letting them know that she is just waiting for her Savior to come and take her home.

Earlier in the day, when the facility is fully staffed with nurses and CNA's helping residents walk, shuffle, inch along on their walkers, or roll along in rollators and wheelchairs, I hear Christmas music blaring from the dining room. I peek out to see several seniors singing carols, remembering, and reciting every lyric, even though many can't even remember the names of their children, who like me, have come by just to spend time with the one who raised them before it's time to say goodbye. Silent night, holy night! Son of God, love's pure light. Radiant beams from Thy holy face With the dawn of redeeming grace, Jesus Lord, at Thy birth Jesus Lord, at Thy birth

I've been a Christian for more than a half-century, and yet, perhaps more clearly than ever, I now see the link between my Savior's birth, earthly death, and eternal life.

Because of His birth I can proclaim, "O death, where is Thy Sting? O grave, where is thy victory?" Because of His birth, I have more empathy for those who use their social media platforms to wish their late loved ones "Merry Christmas in Heaven!" Because of His birth, I will sleep peacefully tonight knowing that when my mother's earthly sleep ends, her new life in Heaven with Jesus will begin. Because of His birth, one day my children will have the same assurance. My hope and prayer are that you may have and share that peace as well. God bless and Merry Christmas.

New pastors were recognized and Dover honored Anita Roy, Karen Mills and Pam Cross for their long-time volunteer service. A big thanks to Dr. Clarke Hawkins and the wonderful folks at Hillcrest Baptist Church for hosting this great gathering of our Dover family and friends.



Dover Baptists Award \$10,000 Grant for Local Missions

During the Executive Committee Meeting on October 11, Dover's New Work Grant was awarded to Biltmore Baptist Church to build additional storage sheds to hold their surplus of donated clothes. Biltmore's thriving clothes closet ministry was featured in the Richmond Times Dispatch on August 22, 2022.

On the first Saturday that the Biltmore Clothes Closet was open, the racks were about 1/3 full. Fourteen people came. Five years later the number of racks has tripled and are filled to capacity. Volunteers spend two mornings a week hanging 50-75 bags and boxes of clothes-most donated by those outside of Biltmore. Many weeks volunteers are forced to stop before finishing because the racks are too packed to hang anymore.

Most Saturdays now more than 200 people come for clothes. Most days, people wait in a line extending into the parking lot to go inside. All clothes are free, and many families leave with two or three large bags.
