From Appreciation to Thanksgiving

I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus. (Philippians 1:3-6 NIV)

As I'm writing this blog, many Christian communities are concluding Pastor Appreciation Month. I'm not sure when or where, or by whom Pastor Appreciation Month was created. I can't seem to find it in the Bible, so I'm assuming Hallmark, or some Christian retailer or church who loved their pastor, or pastor whose love language was "receiving of gifts," put a bug in someone's ear. As a pastor, I loved Pastor Appreciation Month. For me, it was like Christmas when I was a little kid. I received both presents and cards. The main difference between my Christmas cards and appreciation cards, is that the latter often contained gift cards instead of the money I'd get over Christmas from my grandma or favorite aunt. Like Christmas, I also ate a lot more during Pastor Appreciation Month, because "If you bake it, I will come."

Now at the risk of reducing the potential for future favorite foods, snacks, goodies, gifts, and gift cards for my fellow pastors, I'll let you in on a little secret. The greatest joy a pastor gets during Pastor Appreciation Month and throughout the year, are the cards, notes, words of affirmation, encouragement, and prayers of the church they have been called to shepherd. Most pastors, at times, feel inadequate, given that their example is the Perfect Shepherd Jesus. Pastors often beat themselves up each time they feel they have let down even one church member or fall short with the often too high expectations they put upon themselves.

Every pastor I have ever met is thankful for their church

family and friends who support them. Their sentiments are akin to the words of the Apostle Paul, who wrote to the Philippian church, "I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus."

As we begin this next month of Thanksgiving, I want to thank you for supporting your pastor, and pastors, I want to thank you and your wonderful churches for supporting our Dover Baptist Association. 

"Room in the Inn 2021" Moments of Hope Outreach Ministries (MoHope)

Christmas is quickly approaching and so is MoHope's annual Room in the Inn program! With the belief that no one should have to spend Christmas Eve and Christmas Night outside, MoHope's goal is to provide Room in the Inn packages to at least 100 unsheltered households. Given the number of unsheltered children we are seeing, this could impact 150 or so individuals. Packages will include the following:

- One private motel room per household for Christmas Eve and Christmas Night 100 rooms (2 nights) @ \$90/night=\$18,000
- One fast food gift card per family member 150 gift cards @ \$20/card=\$1,200
- Four microwavable meals per family member 600 meals @ \$2/meal=\$1,200
- A warm MoHope hoodie for each family member 150 hoodies @ \$20/hoodie=\$2,000
- Two pairs of new socks for each family member Donated by Bombas sock company!
