Packing 2,400 Toiletry Kits & Collecting 300 or more Food Items* (see below) for the Homeless in the Richmond Region

Dover Baptist Association is partnering with Moments of Hope Outreach to pack toiletry kits for the homeless and collect canned food items for the food pantry. A Moments of Hope donation box will also be provided for financial support of these ministries. Moments of Hope Outreach (MoHope) is a Christ-centered 501(c)(3) nonprofit based in Hanover County, impacting Richmond and five counties. MoHope currently operates a pantry near the Hanover courthouse that provides food, fellowship, and prayer to more than 900 struggling area residents. MoHope's main Saturday events serve hot meals to over 200 people each week. Since November 2015, over 28,664 meals and 143,000 cans of food, and more than 28,000 toiletry kits have been provided.
