

To our Dover Family, Happy New Year!

As we reflect back on the past year we're so grateful to God for the grace that He has extended to us. He called us while we were His enemies, saved us and now allows us to partner with Him to share the good news of salvation that's available to all.

We are amazed at how much God has grown each of us spiritually, engineering our circumstances in such a way that we have come, and are still coming, to depend on Him for insight, upstanding, discernment, and wisdom to properly reflect His glory in every situation and circumstance we encounter.

We're equally amazed at Jesus' church; how He leads some to pray about a particular situation and leads others to move in response to those prayers. That's how we came to be in Cannon Ball, some prayed for God's ministry in Cannon Ball and He lead us to relocate here in response to those prayers. God has lead a couple of other churches in the state, about two hours from Cannon Ball, to invite us to speak about God's ministry here and they were lead to support His ministry here.

We are understanding more about the power of prayer; and when asked what the greatest need here is, our response is always prayer. The real work in ministry is not doing but prayer. When we pray and move according to God's direction He does the work and get's the glory.

It's a privilege and honor to serve God here and were excited about what He's going to do. There is another couple that feels lead to relocate and serve God in this community, and two more who are praying to discern God's call in their lives about relocating and serving here.

Many of you have come over the years to Standing Rock doing VBS in different communities, others have heard about the conditions and environment in which the community members live in. On the surface the outlook seems bleak, but we have hope. For we serve a mighty and awesome God whose power is often displayed in seemingly hopeless situations. Jeremiah 32: 26-27 reads "Then this message came to Jeremiah from the Lord. "I am the Lord, the God of all the peoples of the world. Is anything too hard for me?" Revelation 5:9 "And they sang a new song with these words: "You are worthy to take the scroll and break its seals and open it. For you were slaughtered, and your blood has ransomed people for God from every tribe and language and people and nation."

We are confident that many from Cannon Ball will be included in those that Christ's blood has ransomed for God. We're grateful for the time we had to spend the Christmas holiday at home with our families, we're grateful for our Dover family, but most of all we're grateful for your continued prayers.
