Child Evangelism Fellowship: Connecting Children with Christ

Editor's Note: Child Evangelism Fellowship of Greater Richmond was a 2017 Watson Mission Offering Grant Recipient. The author, David Chrisman, is a member of Poplar Springs Baptist Church and Dover's 2017-2018 Moderator.

One December Sunday morning in 1992, Stephana Dan (an IMB Missionary Kid) returned home from her first semester in college. Stephana attended the College and Career Sunday School Class [taught by Dave Chrisman] at Poplar Springs Baptist Church. She asked me if the class could do something to help the homeless. The Lord took over my tongue (the only way I can explain it) and said, "Well, Stephana, if you arrange it, we will do it!"

By the next Sunday, she had arranged for the class to go every 5th Friday to what was then known as *Freedom House* to serve the evening meal. Poplar Springs is still doing that after all these years, even though the vestiges of the feeding program are now in the hands of the Salvation Army at their Headquarters on 2 West Grace Street, Richmond.

Jumping ahead to July 29, 2016, we noticed several children were in the group that night at the Salvation Army. Through prayer, God led us to speak to Amy Haines, Child Evangelism Fellowship Director for the Greater Richmond Chapter. She agreed that a Good News Club might work there, so we contacted Joanna Brown, at Salvation Army.

Joanna agreed to give the Good News Club a try! Due to remodeling of the facility we did not get to start until the end of February 2017. We continued clubs every Sunday evening at 5:30 until the end of July, then we decided to take a two month break.

During those clubs, one adult and one child accepted Christ as their Lord and Savior. Due to the nature of the facility, the attendance varied and some weeks we had no participants. Now, at Joanna's suggestion, we moved to their Boys and Girls Club in the eastern Church Hill area.

As I am writing this, we have twenty-nine children registered for the club which began on October 12, 2017. Volunteers from other churches have participated in the club. Volunteers from Poplar Springs are serving in two Good News Clubs including New Kent Elementary School, with ten participants!

Child Evangelism Fellowship (CEF) and Good News Club are worldwide Bible teaching ministries, established in 1937 by Jesse Irvin Overholtzer. He believed that Christians needed to pay more attention to the spiritual needs and capabilities of young children. Time and experience has proven that, if we take what Jesus said very seriously, even some three and four year old children can come to the Lord in saving faith.

Barna Research has determined that over 80% of people make their life-direction decisions between the ages of four and fourteen. So, we should make sure kids in that age group have many opportunities to HEAR AND RESPOND TO THE GOSPEL!

God Be with You, Bill

Even a good parting is hard. We celebrate the work of Bill Corey, a friend and valued colleague who has ministered in Dover Baptist Association as a pastor and, in retirement, as a member of Dover Association's staff team. Bill concluded his work with Dover on December 22, 2017.

Bill served as Associate for Ministry to Church Leaders since November 2012. Claude Evans and Bill worked together in this role until Claude's retirement in 2015. Steve Smith joined Bill in 2016.

When Bill first came to Dover Baptist Association as a pastor in 1983, Dover shared office space with Middle District and Richmond Baptist Associations—to say it was cramped is a major understatement! Dover moved to its own office space in 1985.

Bill wrote in the February 2013 Dover Diary, "With our own facilities, Richard Moore began to expand the staff. Doug Frazier came as church planter. Bob Smiddy came bringing his gifts of Church Administration and Religious Education. Finally, Leslie Watson, a retired missionary to Japan, came as a volunteer. Both Leslie and his wife, Hazel, focused on the importance of prayer and missions. A few years ago, Dover renamed our Association Mission Offering in their memory."

Bill went on to say, "In 1996, while I was serving as moderator, Richard Moore retired as our Executive Director. Because I was moderator, I was part of the search committee that brought our fourth Executive Director, Dr. Steven K. Allsbrook, to the Dover Baptist Association. Steve began his ministry with us on January 1, 1997."

Bill began his ministry in 1956 after serving in the United States Navy. Afterwards, he attended Carson-Newman College in Tennessee. Bill and his wife, Joyce, have a daughter and two sons. Bill stated in 2014 that he "wanted to end his full-time ministry as a flowing stream and not as a swamp!"

Bill has helped Dover ministers. He participated in both the Monday and Wednesday support groups for Dover pastors. He has supplied pulpits, often answering the call on very short notice.

Dover only asked Bill to serve ten hours per week. Yet, with all the other things he has done, Bill personally made thirty-four visits to Dover churches in 2017 alone. Bill was always willing to do extra things for Dover, such as making calls on behalf of the Watson Mission Offering and opening the office some mornings.

<u>Dover's Executive Committee will recognize Bill</u> <u>during its meeting on January 9</u>. We plan a little party that evening to celebrate Bill's ministry with Dover.

Finally, as Bill stated in the February 2013 Dover Diary, "What does the future hold? Only God knows! I served two mountain churches as a college student. One woman gave me some good mountain theology – 'God's promises are like pie crusts waiting to be filled."

Grassroots Seminary

"The landscape is rapidly changing. Pastor and staff are key, but God is reaching laypeople to show them what God is doing in our world. He is calling us to be in neighborhoods, schools, workplaces, and more."
