An additional messenger is added for each additional \$400 contribution to the General Fund up to a maximum of seven (7) messengers for any church.

Dover Cares

For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you clothed me, I was sick and you visited me, I was in prison and you came to me.' Then the righteous will answer him, saying, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? And when did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? And when did we see you sick or in prison and visit you?' And the King will answer them, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me.' (Matthew 25: 35-40 ESV)

"It began as does many seemingly insurmountable challenges, with prayer. "Lord, what is my role as a Christian? What is our role, as an association, as a Body of Christ, the term given by the Apostle Paul for the church? This could certainly be the introduction to a myriad of ministry and mission quandaries and prayer petitions, but these prayers were specific to the current crisis in Afghanistan, for the families of those service men & women who gave their lives helping with the evacuation, for those Christian believers who will be left behind as the Taliban assumes complete control, for the thousands of Afghan refugees coming to America, and for those of us who feel called to minister to them.

On August 26, I began by inviting our Dover family & friends to join me in 24 hours of prayer & fasting. I began this day of prayer on September 1 at midnight Kabul, Afghanistan time (3:30 pm our time) as the final wave of troops withdrew from that country. On September 8, Dover Missions Associate Sam and I had a meeting via Zoom with Kate Ayers, Executive Director of ReEstablish Richmond (a Watson Missions partner). Kate and her team are working with other agencies to help reestablish and resettle Afghan families. This meeting led to another larger forum via Zoom on September 16 as Kate participated in a panel of leaders including For Richmond, the International Rescue Committee, and Commonwealth Catholic Charities (who has helped Baptist families with adoption and foster care). The forum was also attended by clergy, lay leaders and compassion advocates. We discussed needs which included housing, legal services, employment, education, and other things many of us take for granted.

One of the immediate needs that surfaced was what was initially referred to as "school supplies" for twenty

"unaccompanied refugee children." As I dug a little deeper, I learned these specific children were separated from their parents while they escaped out of Afghanistan and the status (the life and whereabouts) of their parents is currently unknown. The "school supplies" are for art therapy sessions to help these children cope with the trauma and uncertainty of knowing whether they will ever see their parents again.

On Monday, September 20, I announced an initiative with the working title *Dover Cares* to begin the process of ministering to Afghan refugees. I purchased the first set of art therapy supplies, with the hope that others will follow suit to help these children heal from the trauma of war.

My hope and prayer is that *Dover Cares* evolves into a resource for Dover churches and members who are ministering to those Jesus called the least of these. Although I know this initial step is just a drop in the bucket, as Christians, I thought, that's how we often roll isn't it, one life at a time? Whether it's an immediate act of kindness to another living being, or an act of obedience that hopefully will lead to the saving of an eternal life, the key is to act, because we care.


