#### With A Grateful Heart

A year ago, you invited me to serve as your Dover Interim Executive Director – Someone joked that I'd be the IED – and I promised not to blow the place up!

**Staff** Humor is hallmark of the Dover Staff and it's been a joy serving alongside them in this transition. We've enjoyed numerous meals together and a special outing to Carter Mountain last Fall. The staff serve diligently and faithfully and have a real heart for the Lord and his work among the churches of Dover Association.

**Listening Sessions** We began with a dozen heartfelt conversations – meeting with staff and others - listening to the hurt and hoping for healing during this extended interim season.

**Dover concerns** At our first Dover Council we identified your concerns for the association and areas for potential growth.

Identity – Who are we as an association?
Engagement – How do we engage more people/
churches and especially the next generation in the
work of the association?

Mission – What's our purpose? Why are we here and how do we accomplish this together?

Pastors Through the year our pastors have shared joys and struggles as we met in Ministry Support groups – masks or no masks? We've prayed together at our monthly minister's prayer gatherings and learned together at our monthly Pastor's Health Network Book Discussion group. We socialized and took a moment for renewal at our Advent Mini-Retreat.

Our church leaders have had a number of community conversations regarding the development of a leadership pipeline and cohort, selecting scholarship recipients, exchanging ideas for children and youth ministry.

We've been challenged to adapt to the needs of the post-Quarantine church and searched out answers at the Future Church Summit and Resilient Church Academy.

#### Missions Giving and Going

Our Dover family of churches has been generous with their mission offering supporting multiple ministries in the Richmond area. Our volunteers and WMU have supported the collection of 1859 shoeboxes for OCC, 270 suitcases for the children's home and numerous hygiene kits, activity bags and backpacks for Standing Rock.

We invested in our mission partnership with Tipi Wakan by providing funds for kitchen equipment, media equipment and window replacement in their facilities.

We led a Dover Mission team to the reservation in June – we climbed a butte, met with native pastors, wrestled with historic harms, and envisioned new opportunities for mission partnership.

Administratively we've made forward progress in setting up a database, developing our technology capabilities to host an online conference, prayer gatherings, conversations, and hybrid meetings. We've worked toward reducing our office expenses in the next budget, nominated 15 new folks to committees and councils, and explored potential new mission partnerships.

**Church support** Together we've been able to support the needs of churches and pastors in times of sorrow. We've helped four pastors' families through our emergency relief fund, grieved the losses of loved ones, and prayed through some difficult transitions with others.

We've celebrated 2 pastoral installations and convened 2 ordination councils. We've walked alongside your search committees as they navigate their way to finding a new pastor. We've been there for the retirement recognitions of Dale Ashley, Todd Combee and Ed Shephard (40 – years!), a ground breaking ceremony at Hillcrest – envisioning the dawn of new ministry in the community, celebrating those who've come to Christ during Covid - river baptisms – one on a morning that was 42 degrees! And we celebrate the election of our new Executive Director Rev. Win Davis.

**Wow**- a lot has happened even in the time of Covid- a reminder that God's work doesn't quarantine.

How do you measure a year? As the Broadway musical says, 525,600 minutes are measured in seasons of love. Behind all these statistics are people. God's people in relationship with God and each other, serving the best way you know how and giving all you've got to advance God's kingdom with love.

## Dover WMU Recycling Challenge


September 1, 2021-February 15, 2022


