Sharing & Serving CHRIST in The New Normal (Whatever That Is?)

"Our churches are overflowing, and our phones are ringing off the hook!" This is the sentiment I have received lately from a few churches. Sounds great, right? Perhaps, but probably not in the way you're thinking. The challenge, hopefully opportunity, is these folks aren't overflowing into the pews on Sunday morning, but through the clothes closet lines, and the numerous calls are asking, "What time does the food pantry open?" We may or may not be living in the Last Days, but many are living in tough times.

The plethora of issues during these tough times have been labeled many things, including a "near recession," "postpandemic era," "The Great Divide," "The New Normal" and more. The proliferation of politics and the pandemic, over the last few years, have divided and desolated too many churches. Many are seeking solutions and new ways to engage their communities, and especially, reach the lost.

On Sunday, April 23, several pastors, leaders, members and mission partners of the Dover Baptist Association gathered for our Semi-Annual Meeting. The theme of the event was aptly titled, "Sharing & Serving Christ in The New Normal (Whatever that is)." Our focus was on those things that unite us, including our obedience to God's Great Commandment, Christ's Great Commission, and the admonition of our Lord Jesus, that "whatever you did for the least of these, My brothers, you did for Me."

We learned about a new initiative, called Dinner Church, from the Fresh Expressions movement, which began in the UK. Thousands of people who have been hurt by the church and/or just don't feel comfortable in Sunday morning pews are now filling church fellowship halls to break bread and hear the Gospel message. Homeless veterans, single moms, those in recovery, and those with special needs are just a few groups, who are experiencing the love of Christ, served up by those churches hosting a meal.

Mechanics of Faith, founder, and Cars for Christ pastor, Jason Wells, convinced our mostly traditional Baptist crowd that his tattooed-sleeved arms have opened a few doors to those nonchurch goers who notice he's a bit different than most Baptist preachers. Mechanics of Faith (A Dover Watson Mission Partner) provides free oil changes and basic maintenance to those who are struggling financially. "People shouldn't have to decide whether or not they can afford to fix their car to get to work, or pay their rent, or feed their kid," he tells us. Cars for Christ is a weekly worship and Bible study on Tuesday nights that often begins with a car show. Both allow Pastor J to share and serve Christ in the new normal.

We closed the night with a missions dinner hosted by Colosse Baptist Church. The event's guest speaker was Ezra Bae, a former Korean Baptist pastor and IMB missionary to China. Bae, who now shares the love of Christ with Asian communities in America, stressed that the mission field is now at arm's length. "Just go to Costco," he reminded us, "and you will see many people from many different races, religions and countries who don't know Jesus."

In between our focus on sharing and serving Christ in the new normal, we still managed to do a few traditional things, such as

conduct the business of the association, award college scholarships, give an update on upcoming ministries & missions, announce upcoming revivals in our Dover churches and of course, pray. Those are just a few of the many things our Dover Baptist Association has been doing since 1783 to now, in The New Normal. *God bless*.
