Applications for the 2019 W. Paul Hepler Scholarship must be received in the Dover Office no later than March 15.



GOD'S FINGERPRINTS ON SHALOM New Ministries on a New Site (Ephesians 3:20)

On November 17, Shalom Baptist Church dedicated a new building on 30 acres of land at 8116 Walnut Grove Road in Mechanicsville. A packed house of members and guests gathered for celebrative worship. Four banners --- Thanks, Joy, Shalom, Prayer --- framed the service.

But, the gathering was about much more than simply completing a building. Shalom's members had practiced "prayerful dependence" well in advance. God's hands had been preparing Shalom's new chapter long before it was obvious that His fingerprints were on their congregation's transition to a new site.

Unexpected Opportunities: God's Surprises

Shalom had outgrown its spaces on US360 next to Lowes.

Landlocked on three sides, they bought a house for extra space and considered building a multi-purpose gymnasium. Shalom's members were already looking ahead.

Then, an unexpected call came, inquiring about buying the Shalom property for a Lidl grocery store. In three congregational meetings, members began a process of discerning God's future. In the first gathering, the basic facts about buying the property

were shared. Members were asked to pray for two weeks and write down their questions. The second meeting focused on answering those questions as fully as possible. The third gathering involved a vote. Ninety-one percent (91%) of members approved the sale, and the church's trustees were asked to guide the pathway forward.

Shalom's members showed they were able to debate issues while loving each other. They were teachable, exercised a "let's try" faith, and stepped out. The house they'd bought adjacent to their former site became their transition office. Shalom was ready to birth new ministries.

A move was underway, but it wasn't automatic. As the process slowly unfolded, hurdles from Lidl and Hanover County seemed to block the way forward. Encircled by prayer from Shalom's 115 member prayer chain, with God's help, the faith community watched obstacles melt away.

More Than Expected Growth: God's Provisions

The land on Walnut Grove Road was purchased, and members began to prayer walk the land, imagining possibilities. With a building designed, ground was broken.

Shalom's members --- already equipped by God for their 17-month transition --- stepped forward. Some led sales negotiations or created logistics teams; some managed projects or assisted with set up for worship in a temporary new space; others guided construction and interior design; even cleaning services emerged. With these unique gifts, Shalom's steadfast



practice of "seeking first the kingdom of heaven" came to life. God blessed beyond expectation or explanation.

The church arranged to worship at Pole Green Elementary School and hold their mid-week services at nearby Broadus Memorial Baptist Church. Then, something began to happen that's rare for churches in transition. With congregational unity strong, Shalom grew in attendance and expanded its ministries.

Sixty new members joined the church during services at the school. New ministries were launched, all flowing from God's callings on members' lives. A cancer support group was begun. Just Breathe, a respite group for the caregivers of dementia patients, was launched. Bless the Boots and Bless

> the Desks, two appreciation ministries for the church's construction workers and the teachers at Pole Green Elementary, respectively, were established. Adoption of the nearby Pebble Creek sub-division and the Rescue Squad site across the street from the new church is opening new ministries now. Home fellowship groups are being launched. And, after all of

the new construction and

transitioning, Shalom is praying to be debt-free. Beginnings of new ministries are underway and have momentum.

Prayerful Dependence on God

At the end of the Dedication Service on November 17, those who had worshiped together joined in singing "Bless Be the Tie" and then prayer walked the new building. They asked that God's will be done in each area of the building --- the nursery, choir room, Sunday School spaces for all ages, the Fairmount Fellowship Hall, kitchen and gym and music suite and offices, and even the parking lot. Shalom's new site is prayerfully poised to do God's work.

At every stage of the transition, care has been taken to rely on God fully. When the steeple was hoisted into place, "Adonai" ("Lord of All") was written on the highest point of the structure. When walls were ready to be enclosed, members wrote favorite Scriptures, prayers, and their names on the beams and studs. When members drive by the new building, they ask God for protection. When they drive into the parking lots, they pray for vision.

At Shalom's dedication service on November 17 and its first Sunday worship service on November 18, it was clear that God has left His fingerprints everywhere. When Pastor Mark Miller was asked to sum up the essence of Shalom's transition, he said "prayerful dependence."
