

A new law goes into effect on July 1, 2020 in the Commonwealth of Virginia that may directly impact your church. This law, known as the Virginia Values Act, was signed into law by Governor Northam to extend protections to LGBTQ persons, and appears to apply to churches and other nonprofits. The penalties for associated with violating this law are steep.

The Coronavirus (COVID-19) Pandemic hit everyone hard. The entire world shutdown. Offices shutdown. Even airports and traveling in and out of countries became difficult. The place where many could go in such a time as this, the church, also shutdown. I wondered if the Church could survive in such crisis.

Our church, Tabernacle Praise Ministries International, started going on Facebook live to share our messages. Then we reached out to the less fortunate in our church community by serving breakfast and dinner outside of the Church. We could no longer worship inside our church building and began worshipping outside. This move made it possible to reach out to people we never would have reached if we continued worshipping inside. Some expressed that if it had not been for the seed of the gospel sown in their lives because of our gatherings during these services life could have been worse.

On one occasion, while we gathered outside to feed and share the gospel, it started raining. We had no choice but to stop the outdoor gathering. As we prepared some plates for people to take out, some of the people that came said they could not leave without hearing a word from the Lord. They stood outside, and when the rain stopped, listened to the word of God.

God used this time of crisis, with the closing of the Churches to reach a community in need of the gospel. Since we were locked behind closed doors before, we could not reach them. The church has reached people in different parts of the world through social media. We have reached souls in parts of Africa, Europe, Pakistan and the United States. As we gathered on our Prayer-line six days a week for months. God has done amazing things during these time when it was least expected!

The greatest news is that souls are still being saved even during the time where churches are unable to gather because of the virus. God uses what the devil means for evil for His glory and honor. He has the power to do anything!

Update from a Former Hepler Scholarship Recipient

My name is Jordan Brown and I am the 2017 Hepler Scholarship recipient. Before I received the Hepler Scholarship, I participated in Impact Virginia, CARITAS, Operation Inasmuch, Rise Against Hunger, and various other mission projects through my church, New Highland Baptist Church. My church not only taught me about the role of Christ in my life, but it also taught me how to be the hands and feet of Jesus. We had a sign near the exit of our church parking lot that said you are now entering the mission field. I have been doing mission work with my family since I was born. My mom sang in the choir and I quickly developed a passion and love for music. I sang in the children's choir and went on to be in all of my school choirs. My love for music continued to grow stronger.

Funds from the Hepler Scholarship supported my academic endeavors at Christopher Newport University where I began classes to receive a music education degree to teach. I loved music and I thought I wanted to teach that love of music to children. However, God led me in another direction. After one year at Christopher Newport University, I was given the opportunity to audition for a school in New York for an open spot in their new music program. People from all over the country were competing for this one spot. I did the audition and interview online. After I had completed them, I told my parents what I had done. I really never actually thought that they would pick me, but I wanted to see how they would evaluate me and my voice. I made it to the top 5 and my family and I had to

make a trip to New York for the final interview. I was so scared and very uncertain about what was going to happen next. I asked God to reveal to me what His will was for me at this point in my life. Then I had to listen for His direction. They chose me! My mom cried and I jumped up and down. This had to be God's will. I wasn't meant to teach, but I was meant to perform on the stage. I left Mechanicsville and headed to the New York Conservatory for Dramatic Arts in New York City. My dream of being on the stage was on its way to coming true.

When I got to New York, I felt like I was in another world. There wasn't a Baptist church in sight. My roommates were from all over the United States. It was going to be tough to stand for Christ in such a "foreign" land. My strong faith and the love and support of my family was the force that would sustain me and allow me to be in the world, but not of it. My hope was always that the difference people saw in me wasn't my red hair or the fact that I was from the south, but that I was a follower of Christ. The program was tough, but I persevered and now I have completed my associates degree. I am ready to perform on Broadway. My plan is to live in New York and audition for a Broadway Company. It is so hard to believe that when I started out I was going to teach music and now I am going to perform music on the stage. Only God knows where my career in music is going to take me. I will just continue to listen for Him to guide me. Thanks to the Hepler Scholarship I was able to pursue my dream.

Resource Highlight: Fairmount Baptist Scholarship

The Fairmount Baptist Scholarship was established out of a very generous gift from the former Fairmount Memorial (later Spring Run) Baptist Church. When the church officially dissolved in 2017, Dover was one of the recipients of the remaining funds. The gift was intended for the creation of a new scholarship for ministry education.

The Fairmount Baptist Scholarship provides funds for an individual or groups from Dover churches seeking training for traditional or nontraditional ministry. Funds from this scholarship are also available for an individual pursuing an opportunity to explore or expand his or her ministry calling.

Applicants must be a member of a Dover church for at least a year. He or she must be seeking training for traditional or nontraditional ministry or pursuing an opportunity to explore or expand his or her calling. Priority will be given to new initiatives. Priority will be given to registration and training expenses. Transportation and lodging expenses will be considered.

The maximum annual amount a recipient or group may receive is \$1,500.

Application Requirements:

*Description of how the training will be used to explore and or enhance their ministry or call to ministry

*A letter of recommendation from the pastor, a staff minister, or lay leader which demonstrates the applicant's leadership in the ministries of the church.

Recipients of this scholarship must provide a written report no later than six months following the time the funds were used. In this report, the recipients must share how the funds were used, how they are applying this training to their lives, and if/how the effectiveness of the training could be improved. This feedback will be used by the Fund Team to help evaluate future requests for the similar training.
