Dover churches may send voting messengers to this meeting (see below). In addition to voting messengers, the Association invites any Dover Baptist and their guests to share in this inspiring meeting.

Elect your Messengers! Article 4 of Dover's Constitution states: Each member church shall be entitled to send two messengers to Annual, Semiannual and special Called Association Meetings. A church that contributes at least \$400 to the General Fund during the Association's previous fiscal year shall be entitled to have three (3) messengers. An additional messenger is added for each additional \$400 contribution to the General Fund up to a maximum of seven (7) messengers for any church.

Mental Health and the Church

Statistically, 1 in 5 adults in the United States is struggling with mental illness right now. If our churches reflect cultural norms, as they often do, that means that a significant number of your fellow church members have been affected by mental illness.

Studies show that churches are often the first place someone goes when seeking help. Many churches, however, don't have mental health professionals on staff. Church members may feel overwhelmed in caring for someone with an illness they don't understand. Worse, sometimes wellmeaning Christians may exacerbate the mental illness by encouraging struggling people to pray harder, believe better, or to stop sinning.

I think Jesus has a soft spot in his heart for folks dealing with mental illness. I hope the church will develop that same soft spot, because statistics show that churches come into regular contact with people with mental illnesses, whether we've recognized them or not. Our church members deal with anxiety, depression, biopolar disorder, dementia, trauma and stress-related disorders, and even suicidal ideation.

Paul calls believers to "bear one another's burdens" in Galatians 6:2. How can the church bear one another's mental illnesses -- especially if they all seems foreign to them? Dr. Michael R. Lyles, a psychiatrist who is also a faithful Christian, suggests following a model espoused by Jesus in the Parable of the Good Samaritan. In short, he says, the healthy churches should act like the Good Samaritan to folks we encounter struggling with mental illness. Here are three steps:

1. Healthy churches, like the Good Samaritan, empathize with those struggling with mental illness.

The Good Samaritan, when he encountered the beat up man in Luke 10, didn't make any rash diagnoses. He simply responded empathetically to what he saw: a broken man in need of help. Churches, in the same way, don't need to be mental health professionals to offer a listening ear or to encourage someone in a path to wholeness. In order to best empathize with someone, though, it is helpful to learn what to look for. One of the best resources on mental health and the church is Matthew Stanford's book, Grace for the Afflicted: A Clinical and Biblical Perspective on Mental Illness. Likewise, Kay Warren has become a real advocate for the church's involvement in our country's mental health crisis. Her website, www.kaywarren.com/mentalhealth provides some good starting points.

2. Healthy churches know inn-keepers.

The Good Samaritan acted as a safe person to the broken man he encountered. He treated him with respect and dignity, and he helped him with the resources he had at hand. At the same time, the Good Samaritan wisely realized this man's care was beyond his skill set. Instead of being afraid of what he didn't understand, the Good Samaritan partnered with an inn-keeper who would provide the broken man with what he needed. In our context, mental health professionals can serve as inn keepers. At Goochland Baptist Church, we've had really positive experiences referring folks to the Virginia Institute of Pastoral Care (VIPCare). They are staffed by trained mental health professionals, many of whom are ordained ministers. Every church should have a place like VIPCare on speed dial.

3. Health churches have a mental health plan.

Like the Good Samaritan came back to the inn and checked on the broken man, healthy churches should be intentional about ways to minister to people with mental illness. They look out for families, not just individuals. Pastors and church leaders can create an atmosphere where it's safe for people to be honest. A place where people feel like they can be heard. By visiting church members struggling with mental illness, including them in worship, and acknowledging the widespread nature of mental illness, we help remove the stigma sometimes associated with it. In short, healthy churches address mental illness, just as they would any other challenge in the church.

Mental illness can be scary, but it's important for us all to realize that it doesn't have the last word in our lives. God does. May God empower us all to act like Good Samaritans: we empathize well, we refer to local inn-keepers, and we develop a plan.
