

Rated G for Gospel

Last month, my wife took a tumble playing Pickleball. She broke this, sprained that, tore the ligaments there and bruised a lot of everywhere else. To her dismay, her doctors told her she needed to stay as immobile as possible for at least six weeks. Our date nights have been spent pretty much watching movies: with a rare special occasion of loading crutches and wheelchair and heading to the theater.

Now let me say for the record, I'm not a big movie guy. I'm sure I'll sound like the curmudgeon yelling "Get off my movie screen!" when I confess my favorite movies include titles such as *Casablanca*, *Gone With The Wind*, (the original) *West Side Story*, (the first) *Rocky and The Princess Bride*. For me, it's simple, boy meets girl, boy falls in love with girl, boy fights, sacrifices, or dances for girl, and sometimes girl saves boy or leaves boy (or visa-versa), to save the world, win the war, prove their worth, or just "Frankly, my dear, because they don't give a [darn]."

If you've streamed or been out to the movies lately, you know it's not exactly like that anymore. In the last few movies I've watched, the writers, directors, producers, or whoever has input on the final product seem to feel it's important that I'm made aware of today's secular and cultural norms, especially as it relates to sexuality.

In the last few weeks, I've watched and wondered. Does the leading man who gets the girl in the end, always have to get her in bed? Remember the closing scene from The Princess Bride? "Since the invention of the kiss there have been five kisses that were rated the most passionate, the most pure. This one left them all behind." And that was done on a horse. Do I really need to know the sexual orientation of a superhero before they go out to save the planet? Can't young lovers consider running away and getting married before moving in together? Did I fall asleep after the Golden Age of Hollywood and just need to be "woke"?

I'm not naïve, and I think as Christians, we have often failed miserably at showing love, kindness and understanding to those whose sexual sins are condemned by Scripture. Many of us need to regularly remind ourselves of the words of Christian Reformer and martyr John Bradford, who upon watching condemned criminals being led to their death, observed, "There but for the grace of God, go I."

Do you want to watch the most intense love scene ever? Check out Jim Caviezel in *The Passion of the Christ*, or better yet, open the original script written by the greatest playwright in human history, and turn to Matthew 27, Mark 15, Luke 23, and John 19. Don't stop there. Show someone the happy ending in the chapters that follow so that when it's time to leave the scene, we may all have the confidence of Bradford, who affirmed, as he was being martyred, "Be of good comfort, brother, for we shall have a happy supper with the Lord tonight."

As Christians, we need to unashamedly share the Gospel of Christ. Even though it isn't always rated G, the Gospel, unlike some of the movies I've watched recently, is where you will never be ashamed to take along your momma, or child or even those whose sins, preferences and practices aren't the same as yours.
