Just Say "When"

Ever since I've been in church, some of my fondest memories have involved food. When I was a child, my Sunday school teacher Miss Mable would reward us with homemade gingerbread cookies, if we memorized our Bible verses. When I was a teen, my high school football coach served up spaghetti dinners and Kool-Aid with an ample portion of Christ's love as we gathered for FCA (Fellowship of Christian Athletes). Wednesday night casseroles and potlucks before Bible study, table fellowship, prayer breakfasts and more have intertwined food and faith and been part of my spiritual growth (and occasional physical girth). Most of us would agree that food is one of God's greatest creations, but like other pleasures He created, our love of food has often escalated to our lust for food. In many ways the Golden Arches (and other fast feeders) have become the Golden Calves of worship to both a generation of time-starved over-achievers, and the poor, struggling to afford healthier, more expensive food.

In an article titled The Heavy Holy, published a few years ago in Christianity Today, research released by Purdue University revealed that religious people tended to be heavier than nonreligious. The article also noted that "fundamental Christians," of which Southern Baptist are the most dominant group quote, "Weigh in as the heaviest of all religious groups." Diet related diseases such as high blood pressure, diabetes, stroke and other ailments have debilitated clergy and lay leadership across the country. Churches, seminaries, and Christian non-profits have launched preventative and postoccurrence programs across denominations to the tune of millions of dollars to address the obesity epidemic - money that ironically is often taken from the same budgets used to feed the hungry.

In the sixth chapter of Matthew's Gospel, Jesus begins a lesson, by just saying "When," including, "When you fast."

It's not a coincidence that Jesus sandwiches (pun intended) His instruction regarding prayer in-between giving and fasting. I also believe that it's not a coincidence that spiritual fasting directly impacts the health of our body the Lord created. Study after study reveals the physical, emotional, psychological and spiritual benefits of fasting.

The Bible exemplifies the transforming power of prayer and fasting. Moses fasted as he received The Ten Commandments. King David fasted during his greatest time of mourning and repentance. Queen Esther and her entourage fasted and an entire race of people were saved. The prophets Daniel and Isaiah, and apostles Paul and Barnabas fasted. The latter set apart by the Holy Spirit, upon which time the church, then prayed, fasted and laid hands upon Christ's called to go and make disciples. History is chocked full of Christian leaders who believed Biblical fasting could, would and did make a difference in their ministry, including Martin Luther, John Calvin, John Knox, John Wesley and others.

"Man does not live by bread alone," Jesus quoted the prophet as he prayed, fasted, and was tempted by Satan, "but by everything that proceeds out of the mouth of the LORD." "My food," Jesus added later, "is to do the will of him who sent me and to finish his work." (John 4:34 NIV).

Our food then is to do the will of Jesus who has called us to continue His work. As we kickoff a new fall season, I encourage you, to pray faithfully, give generously and to prayerfully consider fasting as a living sacrifice to the One who prayed, fasted and gave everything for your eternal salvation.
